Program Description

The Masters degree in Statistical Practice (MSP) is a one-year, two-semester professional masters degree program that emphasizes statistical practice, methods, data analysis and practical workplace skills. The MSP is for students who are interested in professional careers in business, industry, government, or scientific research. Students who complete this program will be well trained in the practice of statistics and will be very competitive in the job market. Successful completion of the degree will be grade based; there is no masters thesis requirement or qualifying examination.

Prerequisites

- Bachelor's degree
- Two semesters of calculus
- One course in matrix algebra
- Two semesters of calculus based probability and mathematical statistics (e.g., 36-225 and 36-226 or equivalent)
- One course in advanced data analysis and regression methods (e.g., 36-401 or equivalent)
