For our pretest, we surveyed 11 CMU students total. Our pretest sample included 1 freshman, 2 sophomores, 6 juniors, 1 5th year senior, and 1 2nd year graduate student. Of those sampled, 8 indicated that they were currently living off campus or were considering living off-campus. Thus, 8 out of 11, or about 72.7%, of our pretest sample would initially be considered as part of our target population. However, a further look into the completed surveys suggests that this proportion may be inflated; one or two of the 8 may have been confused over our definition of campus housing, in that they would consider off-campus CMU dorms as off-campus housing. We have addressed this issue in our revisions, as explained below.

Part I

For the first part of the survey, we moved question 6 to question 0. Since our target population is people who have attempted to search for off-campus housing and this survey is not hypothetical, we would not include people who are not considering off-campus housing in our sample. We have also reworded the new question 0 so that respondents would not become confused over our definition of off-campus housing. For question 2, we changed "circle all that apply" to "circle most relevant." This change will make our results easier to examine and code. Based on the comments and pretest results, we added the category of "5th year senior" in question 3. For question 5, we reworded it as "have regular access to a car" instead of "own a car" from pretest feedbacks, since people who have access to friend's car might give similar responses as people who own a car and should be grouped together.

Part II

Based on Professor Junker's feedback, we reformat part 2 into 4 questions (6 through 9). Question 6 identifies whether a person has searched for off-campus housing or not. If they have searched for off-campus housing, they answer question 7, which includes parts a through c. If they have not searched for off-campus housing, they answer question 8a and 8b. And question 9 is open ended for all respondents. The question numbering in this initial survey is for the purpose of display, however, we will use the branching features of an online survey service in the actual execution of the survey. Based on our pretest, we clarified question 7b and 8b by rephrasing complicated nouns into simpler statements. Additionally, we changed the scales into a agree/disagree scales.

Part III

For part III of the questionnaire, we clarified the meaning of apartment and house. This way the survey takers will not be confused as to what counts as a house and what counts as an apartment. For question 11, we changed the word "housing" to "residence" to clarify the word "residence" include both apartments and houses. Also, in question 13, we have added more options to try to include all possible choices that might arise. However, we left question 14 alone because people who live off campus, at times tend to prefer sharing a room, not just an apartment with others. For example, some might prefer to share a studio apartment to save money. Question 16 will be all programmed on the website or survey tools for later purpose. Furthermore, people will answer all the parts of the question regardless of preferring a house or an apartment. For question 17 we took out the choice of price range and changed it to manually filling in the range. This will give more flexibilities to people in filling the price.
